## Focus on Vienna, Austria

We have assisted in Reggie Hiller's support for several years in Vienna, Austria. She recently wrote that she has been directing a "shelter ministry for about 10 years." Through this ministry, she has been evangelizing the children and families living in the homeless family shelter. These families "are from diverse countries and cultures ranging from Afghanistan, Africa, Serbia and Turkey." She has led many to Christ from Islamic, Russian and Serbian Orthodox and Catholic backgrounds through this outreach and many of them have moved on to Norway, the Netherlands, Nigeria, USA, and other locations in Austria.

In addition, "I have taught the Gospel at our new youth center and teach the 10-12 yr. olds at one of the native congregations Sunday mornings."

"My late father, Bob Hare, helped start this work among the Austrians when I was a child. We had a Wednesday night Bible study in English for our African brethren and contacts at my home for many years. In September, I hope to pick it up again. This Wednesday night class has been taught by different brethren in our congregation, or with the help of videos and DVDs."

"Three children live with me now from the Shelter ministry. The oldest, Sandra, was baptized last summer. I will continue to reach out to these young people, including their families, to let them know how much our Lord loves and cares about them. Also, it is my goal to win those back who have fallen away, for whatever reasons, and nurture them in the Lord. Last year 10 of these precious souls, ranging in age from 13-18, made the decision to be followers of Christ. They need to be tended to so that they may withstand temptation and become strong in the Lord and help bring others to Christ as well."
